Evening of Honor

October 6 saw a sell-out crowd of 250 veterans and guests attend an **Evening of Honor** presented by the MVAT Foundation in partnership with American Legion Ronald Reagan Pacific Palisades Post 283. Representing MVAT were Board Chair Doug Berl, Board Vice Chair Bob Jerome, Board Members Larry Schnadig and Pete Seitz, Executive Director James Colbert, and Heroes Linked Program Director David Tenenbaum.

Held at the Luxe Sunset Boulevard Hotel in Los Angeles, the event featured Medal of Honor Recipients Command Sergeant Major Gary Littrell and Specialist Jim McCloughan engaging in a discussion of their battlefield experiences and their lives since receiving the Medal of Honor with a special focus on how mentoring and network building not only assisted them but enabled them to assist those who separated from active service after them. Vice Chair Bob Jerome led the discussion.

The audience members' questions for Jim and Gary after the presentation were outstanding. Thirty minutes after the event ended, the vast majority of the audience remained engaged in networking with each other throughout the meeting room, the reception patio, and the hotel's hallways.

Gala

Renowned actor, producer, and veterans advocate Joe Mantegna received the MVAT Foundation's Don Schwarz Distinguished Service Award at the annual Gala on **October 8**.

The pre-dinner portion of the Gala, held at the Los Angeles home of Dr. Frank Luntz, featured video presentations on MVAT's program achievements including the Veteran's Home Repair pilot program and Heroes Linked.

This year's nationally televised 2022 Memorial Day PBS Special from the Mall in Washington DC included a special tribute in which Joe Mantegna and actress Joan Smart portrayed MVAT Advisory Board Member Maj. Gen. (ret.) Mark Graham his wife Carol and told the story of their two sons' deaths in service to the country. After the televised segment was shown to the Gala audience, Mark and Carol were reunited on stage with a visibly moved Joe Mantegna.



The program to present the Don Schwarz Distinguished Service Award to Joe Mantegna followed the dinner service. Don Schwarz founded the MVAT Foundation in 2009 and served as its Chairman and guiding light until a few months before his May 2021 passing.

A video showcasing Joe's efforts over the past two decades in support of veterans and the U.S. Armed Forces was shown and Board Chair Doug Berl delivered remarks about Don. Board Vice Chair Bob Jerome introduced a video tribute from fellow actor and renowned veterans advocate and philanthropist Gary Sinise. MVAT supporter Howard M. Bernstein introduced Joe and presented him with the award. Joe delivered an eloquent and heartfelt response.

Following the award ceremony, Board Vice Chair Bob Jerome led a presentation featuring Medal of Honor recipients Lieutenant Colonel Will Swenson (MVAT Board of Advisors), Command Sergeant Major Gary Littrell, Master Chief Petty Officer (SEAL) Britt Slabinski, and Specialist Jim McCloughan.

Veterans Home Repair

A crew of MVAT volunteers worked on service-disabled USAF Veteran Daniel Munoz's Whittier, California home as part of a pilot program focused on Veteran's Home Repair on **October 7**. Mr. Munoz was no longer able to keep up with the extensive repairs needed to keep his home habitable and safe for him and his extended family.

Television coverage of the effort was captured by local ABC and NBC affiliates, and footage from their interviews made the evening news. The Whittier Daily News ran a story on the event that also appeared in the publisher's other regional editions.

Carried out in partnership with the Los Angeles chapter of Habitat for Humanity, the crew of volunteers was led by Board Vice Chair Bob Jerome and included Board members Candice Appleton, Medal of Honor recipient Jack Jacobs, Tom Rooney, Larry Schnadig, and Pete Seitz as well as Advisory Board member Medal of Honor recipient Will Swenson. They were joined by Medal of Honor recipients Jim McCloughan and Gary Littrell and MVAT Executive Director James Colbert.



Heroes are veterans, active duty service members in the process of separating from military service, military spouses, and Gold Star Family Survivors, those who lost a family member in service.



Networking User Growth




At the end of 2022, there are 1,900 Heroes and Advisors actively using Heroes Linked's **Networking Tools** to communicate via electronic messaging, telephone calls, and video calls carried out on the platform with month-over-month growth.

The biggest challenge facing veterans today is establishing positive post-service careers. Heroes Linked provides veterans across the country with the critically needed services of mentoring, advising, and networking in an easy-to-use online platform.

Job acquisition, which was a major focus in the wake of the 2009 recession, is no longer an issue relative to assisting veterans to navigate their employment and build careers. As of October 2022, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the unemployment rate for all U.S. veterans was 2.5% while the rate for the American labor force as a whole stood at 3.7%.

Throughout the 12 months of 2022, an average of 3,715 active open positions seeking veteran applicants appeared in the **Jobs Section** of the Heroes Linked platform, posted by Advisors as well as dynamically drawn from the Indeed and WayUp job platforms.

Advisors post **Referrals** where they can be of direct assistance via guidance for Heroes on the specific company, position, and application best practices.

LAPD Taps Heroes Linked to Reach Veterans Across the USA

The Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) is utilizing Heroes Linked to reach veterans across the country about career opportunities within the nation's third-largest municipal police department.

The awareness campaign kicked off with a video message from LAPD Deputy Chief Alan Hamilton, Commanding Officer of LAPD's Valley Bureau, comprising two million residents spread across 260 square miles.

Chief Hamilton's clear message is that the LAPD is a career-oriented organization that offers generous incentives for veterans and active-duty personnel transitioning from service.
